From Rev Tom

When I was in the latter years of High School, a student in the year below caught my attention. He carried guite a few extra kilograms than others his height. He always looked in need of a haircut, and would at least do well with some time in front of a mirror with brush and comb. His clothes always looked like they had spent the past week on the floor. I remember on one occasion seeing him with his shirt buttons done up misaligned. That was just embarrassing. He was often not at school. I don't remember thinking much about him, but I do remember my attitude. When I saw him, I had an internal reaction, that he was a rather undesirable creature. His name was Michael. I left Parkes at the end of High School only to return 20 years later. In November 2017 I was contacted by Enid. Enid told me her husband had died and she wanted me to do a graveside funeral. It so happened that her husband was Michael. Enid told me that when Michael was a boy both his parents were killed in a car accident. He was raised by his two older sisters, who weren't much interested, and he would drift from one home to another. It would be better said that Michael raised himself. Enid also told me that when they met, Enid already had three children. All the same, Michael married her and raised the children as his own. It was a bit of a day of reckoning for me, as I heard her story, and Michael's story (I was deeply grateful to do his funeral). What sort of assumptions did I have that caused me to judge Michael the way I did? My experience gave me an enlarged appreciation of the gift of my parents, who loved me and cared for me. They made sure I turned up to school each day. They made sure my hair was cut and combed. They made sure my clothes were clean and ironed, and my shoes shone with polish. I barely did any of that for myself ... they did it for me! How could I feel so almighty as to judge Michael when qualities that I thought I had were simply a part of the privilege of my life circumstances? As I have continued in my life journey I have had many experiences that have taught me not to judge. Sure, I might not approve of certain behaviours. For example, if I have helped someone buy some essential items and as soon as they get more money they spend it on abundant quantities of alcohol, I will ask questions the next time they want help. All the same, I accept that person without judgment of who they are. Why? How do I know what they have been through? How do I know about the weird tricks of life that lead to certain behaviour patterns? The truth is, I am no different from that person. I am no different in respect to the fact that I am largely a product of a genetic and nurturing heritage that is my parents, and a set of largely accidental experiences and particular formative stages of my life. So, what does this mean? DON'T JUDGE!! Most people have heard me refer dozens of times to Jesus saying, "metanoia", typically translated as "repent". That is a hugely inadequate translation, particularly given how we interpret the word repent. In any case, Jesus' invitation was to take us beyond all of our conventional thinking. Jesus also says "for the kingdom of God is at hand!" If we ever are not aware of the presence of the kingdom of God it means we are not in a state of metanoia, and how many of us can say we are abundantly conscious of the presence of the kingdom of God? Certainly not me! We should be getting an idea of the difficulty of the task, a greater a task than for a camel to walk through the eye of a needle (given we are all so rich with self-approval and other condemnation).

I practice daily letting go my thoughts of judgement, of self and others (mostly unsuccessfully) so that there just might be the space for the kingdom of heaven to shine through ... and indeed, there are moments. But first of all, we have to realise how trapped we are in our ordinary thinking, and behaviour patterns, whether they are considered good or bad. We are no better or worse for them than those of someone else. We all fall short of the glory of God. So, let's let it all go so the glory of God can get centre stage.

This diary provides an opportunity to pray each week for congregations in the Presbytery. By praying together, we can encourage one another in mission, as we grow in faith and unity and develop understanding and relationships across the region. Each week there will be information and a prayer for each of the congregations in the Hunter Presbytery. This week we pray for:

6th October 2024 – Toronto Uniting Church

Toronto Uniting Church meets every Sunday at 9am with an attendance of approximately 50. Our Minister is a Deacon, Rev Allison Forrest. We have Ministry Teams which generally meet monthly and who report to our Church Council every two months. We have a weekly Christian Meditation Group, a monthly Prayer Group, a fortnightly Kinship Care Group, a monthly Men's Coffee Group and a weekly Faith Nurture Study Group. Our congregation are mainly in the over 60's age group at present. We are grateful for the receipt of a Presbytery Mission Development Grant, which has helped with the funding of the installation of new audio-visual equipment and will also be used to implement "Toronto Uniting Church Online" – a project which aims to open up some new ways into worship and discipleship for people not currently attending in-person worship. We hope that this project will open up ways for us to welcome in younger people, to get involved in the life of our church, and to take up opportunities to get creative in video and digital media production.

Prayer: For the Ongoing work of the TUC Online Project. Pray that a good number of our members will be equipped to operate the AV system confidently. Pray also for wisdom and encouragement for the members of the project team, as they guide this complex work. The Kinship Carers group – give thanks for the friendship, support and compassion shared between its members. Please pray that all the children and teenagers connected to this support group experience a wonderful year of life and growth. Each member of each Ministry Team – thanks for the gifts, skills and commitment which each person contributes to the mission of the church. Amen.

Spiritual Practice of the Week

The Examen: The Examen is a practice for discerning the voice and activity of God within the flow of the day. It is a vehicle that creates deeper awareness of God-given desires in one's life.

Practice: Find a quiet moment to reflect on your day or week. Open your palms and ask the Holy
Spirit to show you the moment for which you are least grateful. What made that moment difficult?
Be with your feelings; don't try to change them or make them acceptable. Offer them up to God. Talk to him about them.
Where was God in this moment? You may want to thank God that he is always ready to be with you and talk to you.

The following nominations have been received for the Church Council election on 27 October:-


Sue Warren has been nominated for SFED position,

Notes from Church Council Chairperson

This week's Church Council meeting began with a worship time where we thought about who we are. Who is God inviting us, as individuals and as a congregation, to be? Who are we as a community of God's people when we let go of buildings, activities, and people who have been alongside us for decades? What might have withered in us and is seeking rejuvenation, or to be allowed to die? We hold these questions as we celebrate the abundance and lavishness of God's love, friendship and presence within us.

Here is a summary of the discussion points at the meeting.

- We continue to explore options for the ways in which the mission of the congregation will move forward in coming month:
 - We have received a sales strategy and marketing recommendation from Knight Frank for the Garden Suburb property as we explore options. Synod is to be asked about their view of selling the property, and Lake Macquarie Council will be approached to see if they have an interest in the property for open space.
 - In cooperation with Presbytery, there will be a transition to retirement plan worked on for Tom, which will include the Neos mission. It may include the employment of other workers.
 - SFED has suggested that we are intentional about creating relationships with the people and groups who use the Charlestown property. A part- time worker might connect with users and a TV screen in the foyer be used to promote community and congregation activities. This would also include an upgrade of our website to include a broader community focus.
- Tom will be taking a period of extended leave from the end of December into February. Preachers are being approached to prepare and lead our worship services during that time.
- Les Butchers has advised that he will be stepping down from the role of auditor after many years. The Church Council thanks Les, and appreciates the contribution of his expertise.
- We have been officially advised that our NREMA grant (for the Whitebridge sale proceeds) has been approved. We are required to sign a grant agreement, the funds will be invested and in time the income stream will commence. The Church Council also approved \$62,000 to be drawn down to attend to urgent external repairs on the Charlestown building.
- Cathy reported that there are eight children attending the Holiday Kids on 8 October. A recommendation was accepted to conclude this activity. Cathy will determine if there is interest in an Advent Workshop in December. The Church Council agreed that the Holiday Kids external helpers will be invited to attend worship on Sunday 3 November, where they will be acknowledged for their contribution in "Children's Corner". Cathy also offered to organise an SRE service on a Sunday morning in early 2025 which was warmly accepted.
- There was a discussion about the ongoing use of CHaGS properties by the Hunter Community Alliance (HCA). It was decided that this arrangement will continue subject to availability, and that as we are a member of the alliance there will be no charge, with the expectation that the property will be left clean and tidy. An offer to provide refreshments to attendees at HCA events will be subject to the availability of our people at the time.
- Some nominations have been received for Church Council vacancies, but a number of vacancies remain. Please consider if you are able to serve in this way, or if there is someone else you could nominate.

• The Council has been asked by a member of the congregation to consider replacing the pews in the Charlestown worship space. This request was minuted, and will be addressed when a firm decision about the Garden Suburb property has been made, as we have chairs at Garden Suburb which are comfortable and in "as new" condition.

After five years, this is my last "Notes" to you as Chairperson. These years have brought tremendous change and great challenges to the life of our congregation. We adjusted to life as a congregation when we weren't able to meet in person for nine months, we have accepted the challenge of creating a legacy beyond the life of our current congregation and we have let go of property and more significantly, farewelled dearly loved members of our congregation. Even so, we remain confident of God's presence within us and in the midst of our community, and are thankful that God continues to lavish great love upon us.

May God continue to bless and keep us.




